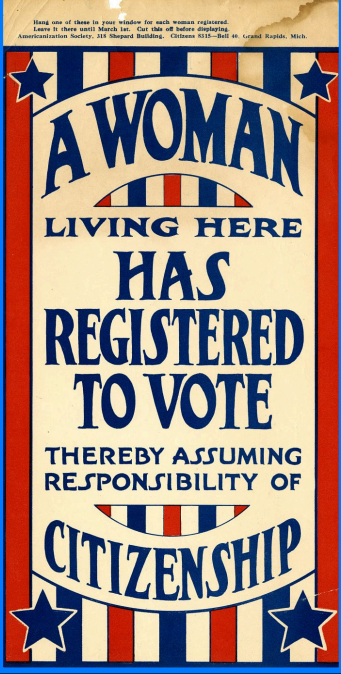

If you work, take a cab, or share a ride, or walk.

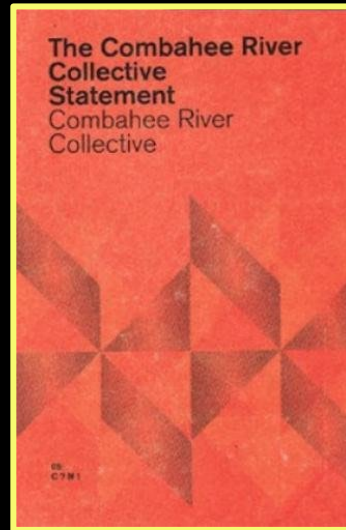
Come to a mass meeting, Monday at 7:00 P. M. at the Holt Street
